One of the oldest areas of the state, the Crossroads region is the site of much history as well as some of the state's best fishing and outdoor recreation. From historic Natchitoches, founded in 1714 as the oldest European settlement in the Louisiana Purchase Territory, to the wide appeal of the Toledo Bend Reservoir area to serious anglers everywhere, Crossroads is the preferred destination of many outdoor enthusiasts.
