SUBJECT: Updates to HR Handbook Chapter 22

REASON FOR UPDATE: This notice is to inform agencies of updates to Chapter 22 as it relates to additional test exemptions provided in SCS policy and updates to the list of accepted accrediting associations.

EFFECTIVE DATE: October 1, 2022

The updates provide additional test exemptions for applicants who are currently serving in a job appointment and converting to a probational appointment in the same job title, applicants who previously attained permanent status and occupied a job in a test series that are now appointed to a probational appointment or job appointment in a job requiring the same test, and applicants who are employed at the State Civil Service Testing and Recruiting Center and/or who serve as State Civil Service test monitors. Applications in NEOGOV will now include additional options on the standard question regarding test exemptions for an applicant. Applicants are encouraged to update their master profile with this information if they are applicable to any of the new testing exemptions.

Additionally, SCS now evaluates the accreditation of post-secondary institutions based on the United States Department of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation to determine if an institution is appropriately accredited.
