Subpoenas not relevant to the issues in this appeal may be denied.

A continuance of the hearing will only be granted based on a written motion and accompanying order, with documents attached supporting the reason you are requesting a continuance. It will only be granted for compelling cause or to serve the ends of justice. Obtaining an attorney at the last minute is not compelling cause. If you are given a continuance and your appeal is ultimately granted, the Commission or the Referee may deny you any compensation for that portion of time lost because of the continuance. See Rule 13.18(b). We accept all filings by email to scs-appeals@civilservice.la.gov. If there has been a continuance issued for a prior hearing date, new subpoenas must be requested by parties for the hearing dates in this notice.
